Summary

In the *All of Us* program, the National Association of Hispanic Nurses (NAHN) has been prioritized as an essential community engagement partner. The purpose of this presentation is to provide an overview of the *All of Us* program, discuss the development of the partnership between *All of Us* and NAHN, identify the need for minority participants, discuss the barriers of research participation of minorities, present a successful collaboration with NAHN and *All of Us* to enhance recruitment of Latinos in the program.

All of Us Research Program, originally called The Precision Medicine Initiative® (PMI) Cohort Program, is the largest health and medical research program on precision medicine. A set of core values guides its development and implementation.

The goal of the *All of Us Research Program* is to recruit one million participants from all across the U.S. Participants will be asked to contribute their health information that will identify better ways to prevent and treat diseases that are based on individual health, environment, and lifestyle. The goal of the program is to reflect inclusivity of all people in

our country.

About our Presenter

Norma Graciela Cuellar, PhD, RN, FAAN, is a Full Professor of the Capstone College of Nursing at The University of Alabama and the President of the National Association of Hispanic Nurses (NAHN). She is the editor of *Journal of Transcultural Nursing*. As an educator for 29 years, Dr. Cuellar has taught in a variety of nursing schools including diploma, baccalaureate, masters, and doctoral programs. She has over 60 publications and has over 100 presentations at international, national, and regional levels. Her research focus has been on diversity, alternative medicine, and sleep. She currently has a \$1.8 million dollar grant with HRSA on improving workforce diversity in the Latino population.

She has been active in the development of the *All of Us Grant* (NIH) through community partnerships with NAHN. She received 2 grants in collaboration with NAHN with *All of Us*. The first grant was to educate and increase awareness in Latino health care providers. The second grant was to educate Latinos in the community about the *All of Us Research Program*, developing trust through community partnerships.
